
LEGAL PRACTICE: JUDICIARY SURVEY OF ATTORNEYS' KNOWLEDGE, PERCEPTION, AND USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE – MARCH 25, 2024

On Monday, March 25, 2024, the Judiciary will distribute an anonymous survey to registered, active New Jersey attorneys to better understand the knowledge, perception, and use of artificial intelligence, specifically generative artificial intelligence, within the New Jersey legal profession.

For purposes of the survey, Generative AI is defined as a subset of AI in which machine-based systems create text, images, or other content based on predictive models derived from training with large datasets. An example of this type of Gen AI would be to use ChatGPT, Bard/Gemini, or CoPilot to draft a letter or essay on a requested topic.

By completing the survey, attorneys will provide valuable information about current understanding and views of Generative AI within the legal community. This information will inform future education and training initiatives as well as the ongoing work of the Supreme Court Committee on Artificial Intelligence and the Courts.
