INTRODUCTION

This 2016 statistical report, prepared by the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) and submitted to the Governor, the Legislature and the Advisory Council on Domestic Violence, provides Judiciary statistics compiled on domestic violence matters brought before the New Jersey courts pursuant to the Prevention of Domestic Violence Act, N.J.S.A. 2C:25-17 et seq. (PDVA).

This report presents data regarding domestic violence filings, dispositions of restraining orders, and forms of relief sought and granted. It also includes data on non-indictable contempt charges, which are processed in Family Court pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9(b). As set forth in detail in the following pages, in 2016 the number of Domestic Violence filings increased by 1% (1251 actual filings) over 2015.

This report is prepared annually by the Judiciary as required by the PDVA. Unfortunately, this submission was delayed due to a systems interface issue with a partner agency, which created inaccuracies in the data. The issue was identified prior to the finalization of the report and corrected. The report reflects the corrected data.

The collection and analysis of domestic violence data assists in the creation or modification of policies and procedures to help effectuate the PDVA's purpose of providing victims with maximum protection from domestic abuse.

Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1991, N.J.S.A. 2C:25-17 et seq.

New Jersey's PDVA is one of the strongest laws in the nation addressing domestic violence. The PDVA provides the following:

- Domestic Violence definitions, including the nineteen offenses from which a person is protected under this act.
- Domestic Violence training requirements for judges, law enforcement and court staff.
- Guidance to law enforcement regarding the following:
 - The arrest of the alleged attacker
 - The seizure of weapons
 - Filing of a criminal charge or a civil temporary restraining order (TRO)
- Requirements and process if a criminal domestic violence charge is filed against the defendant, including sentencing conditions if found guilty.
- Requirements and process for filing a civil complaint alleging domestic violence in the Family Court.
- Penalties or fees to be assessed against the defendant.
- Details the contempt process that is applied when a defendant has violated a court order.
- Defines the confidentiality of domestic violence records

- Requires New Jersey to maintain a central registry of all persons who have a domestic violence restraining order entered against them.

Statutory Amendments

Effective August 10, 2015, the PDVA was amended to add four additional offenses, also known as "predicate acts." The four added predicate acts are:

- Criminal coercion, N.J.S.A. 2C:13-5;
- Robbery, N.J.S.A. 2C:15-1;
- Contempt of a domestic violence order, N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9(b), which constitutes a crime or disorderly persons offense; and
- Any other crime involving the risk of death or serious bodily injury to a person protected under the "Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1991," N.J.S.A. 2C:25-17 et seq.

Additionally, the PDVA, specifically N.J.S.A. 2C:25-19, was amended to clarify that a "victim of domestic violence" includes any person who currently is or has at any time been a household member with the defendant. This amendment broadened the definition of household member.

Effective May 9, 2016, the Sexual Assault Survivor Protection Act (SASPA), N.J.S.A. 2C:14-13 et al., was enacted, allowing a victim of non-consensual sexual contact, sexual assault or lewdness to apply for a temporary order of protection. This law provides victims not eligible for a TRO under the PDVA to make an application in the Superior Court for a Protective Order. This report does not currently provide statistical information on SASPA filings; future reports will, however, include this data.

Legal Process

Civil Procedure:

Procedurally, the PDVA provides that a single domestic violence incident may give rise to both civil and/or criminal remedies. In the civil process, a domestic violence civil complaint is an application for a TRO. A victim may apply for a TRO in either Superior Court or Municipal Court. If a civil TRO is granted, a hearing is usually held within 10 days to determine whether the TRO will become a final restraining order (FRO).

FROs include two primary types of relief to the victim: (a) injunctive relief, and (b) non-injunctive relief. Injunctive relief directs the defendant's action, i.e., to have no contact with the victim, and/or to stay away from certain locations. Non-injunctive relief may include imposing financial penalties and obligations, the relinquishment of property and/or possessions, child support, and emergency monetary relief. The purpose of non-injunctive relief is to permit the victim to exist without the need to return to the abusive relationship, N.J.S.A. 2C:25-29b(10).

Criminal Procedure:

A criminal complaint involving domestic violence addresses criminal charges. Law enforcement must arrest the defendant and sign a criminal complaint if they find probable cause that domestic violence occurred along with certain other conditions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:25-21.

Violations:

Contempt charges are the means by which TROs and FROs are enforced. When a defendant violates the provisions of a restraining order, a contempt charge is filed by law enforcement or the victim themselves. Violations of a restraining order may result in civil contempt proceedings and/or criminal charges.

The degree of the contempt charge determines whether the Family Division or the Criminal Division will hear the case. The Family Division has exclusive jurisdiction if the violation involves a petty disorderly persons offense or if the violation involves parenting time or property. The Criminal Division hears contempt charges if the defendant committed a violation that constitutes an indictable offense. A prosecutor is involved in all criminal contempt charges regardless of whether the case is heard in Family or in Criminal.

Recent Initiatives for Domestic Violence (2016)**STOP Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant**

The United States Department of Justice provides grant funding to the states to fight violent crimes against women as well as create and strengthen victim services. In 2016, the Judiciary used this grant funding to provide the annual statewide Domestic Violence Conference that is held each spring for all Family Division judges, managers, and domestic violence staff. The 2016 conference included sessions on human trafficking, teen dating abuse, elder abuse and Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender and Questioning (LGBTQ) cultural competency.

Additionally, with VAWA funding, the AOC's Family Practice Division was able to collaborate with Rutgers University to provide vicinage domestic violence staff with the Violence Against Woman and Children Professional Training Program (VAWAC-PT). VAWAC-PT is a unique and engaging program that provides professionals the knowledge and the practical skills needed in order to understand and effectively address the myriad of issues faced by people who are victims of violence. Staff who complete the full complement of courses receive a Domestic Violence certification from Rutgers University.

Electronic System Enhancements

The Judiciary employs several electronic systems to track, docket, and process domestic violence restraining orders. The Electronic Temporary Restraining Order (eTRO) system is the electronic data entry program that is used by law enforcement and Family Court staff to create electronic civil domestic violence complaints, TROs and FROs. The Family Automated Case Tracking System (FACTS) is the mainframe program that houses the official electronic court records. The Domestic Violence

Central Registry (DVCR) is a registry of all persons who have a domestic violence restraining order entered against them.

The following system enhancements were made to FACTS, DVCR and eTRO in 2016:

- The new predicate acts and household member definition were added to the TRO template in eTRO.
- The ability to create, docket and process SASPA cases was added to the FACTS system. In the future, this case type will be processed through eTRO, similar to the domestic violence cases.
- General enhancements were also made to FACTS and eTRO to improve case management, ensure consistency in providing victims services, and to improve communication with law enforcement.
- A FACTS enhancement provides alerts and case discharge information to the new Pretrial Monitoring risk assessment software for criminal contempt cases.

Domestic Violence Statistical Data

This report presents data regarding domestic violence filings, dispositions of restraining orders, and forms of relief sought and granted. It also includes data on non-indictable contempt charges, which are processed in Family Court pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9(b). This report is prepared annually by the Judiciary as required by the PDVA. Unfortunately, it was delayed due to a systems interface glitch with a partner agency causing the statistics to be inaccurate. The issue was identified prior to the release of the report and the data has now been corrected.

**SECTION FOUR
POST-DISPOSITIONAL RELIEFS**

Enforcement of Domestic Violence Temporary Restraining Orders (TROs) or Final Restraining Orders (FROs) can be pursued either through the criminal contempt process, N.J.S.A.2C:29-9b or N.J.S.A.2C:25-30, or the civil enforcement of litigant's rights process under R.1:10-3. Under the criminal statute, violations of any restraints and certain reliefs and conditions of a restraining order require mandatory arrest and criminal prosecution. Violations of other reliefs and conditions are enforceable by the court pursuant to applicable court rules. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's domestic violence contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b. This includes contempt charges that were initially indictable but have been downgraded by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The following section reports the data on those cases. It does not cover indictable contempts of the fourth degree and above, which are handled in the Criminal Division.

Criminal Practice Cases - Filings & Dispositions

A criminal case is identified as involving domestic violence when there is a charge of contempt for violating a domestic violence restraining order (N.J.S.A. 2C:29-9b) or the case has been flagged by the Prosecutor as a domestic violence matter. Filings include initial complaints, direct indictments and direct accusations. Indictments resulting from complaints are counted as a filing when they first enter the system as initial complaints.

A disposition is the final resolution of a case. Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) admissions are also included in these statistics. The category 'Transfer to Family' are those contempt cases that were initially identified as indictable, but have been downgraded to disorderly person's domestic violence contempt cases by the Prosecutor's Office in the county of venue. The Family Division has jurisdiction over disorderly person's (DP) contempt actions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2C:29-2b. The category 'Transfer to Other' are those cases transferred to another jurisdiction, transferred to the Attorney General or sent to Casino Prosecution.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.

Municipal Court Complaints - Filings & Dispositions

The following tables provide information regarding the number of domestic violence complaints processed by the municipal courts. A complaint, which may include more than one charge, is designated a domestic violence complaint if at least one charge constitutes a domestic violence offense under N.J.S.A. 2C:25-19a.

For the present analysis, a 'filed' domestic violence complaint is one that falls within the initial jurisdiction of the municipal court. This includes most domestic violence related disorderly persons and petty disorderly persons offenses. Domestic violence complaints that include indictable and other charges that statutorily fall within the jurisdiction of the Superior Court, even if filed in municipal court, are not counted. Those filings are properly reflected in the criminal section of this report.

The disposition information includes all domestic violence complaints adjudicated by a municipal court. This includes all cases falling within the initial jurisdiction of a municipal court as well as cases downgraded and remanded back to municipal court by the County Prosecutor.

The number of filings and dispositions are based on the FILING date and DISPOSITION date, respectively, and are independent of one another for the time period listed.
