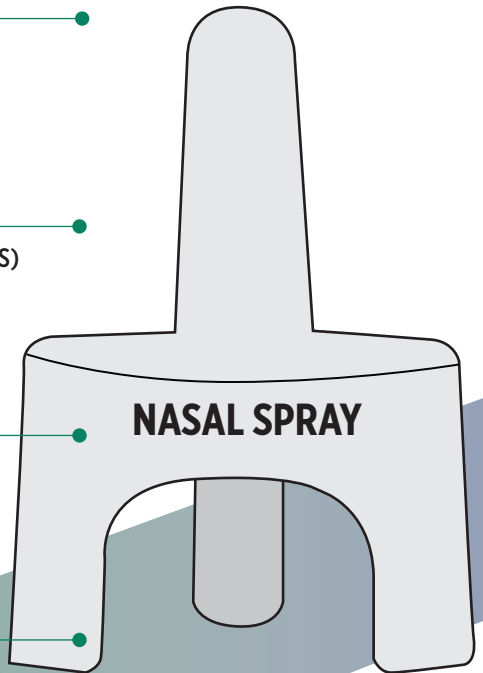

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O P I O I D O V E R D O S E

Symptoms of Overdose

- Person will not wake up.
- Slow or no breathing.
- Pale, ashy, cool skin.
- Blue lips or fingernails.

What to Do

- Call **9-1-1** immediately.
- Tell the dispatcher where you are and that someone is not breathing or is unconscious.
- Place the person on their side.
- Administer Naloxone if you have it.
- Perform rescue breathing: Tilt head back. Lift chin. Pinch nose. Give a full breath every five seconds.

What is Naloxone?

Naloxone is an FDA-approved medication used to save individuals who overdose on opioids. Naloxone has been used by emergency room and first responder staff to reverse symptoms in seconds.

Why get Naloxone?

Anyone who uses opioids or suffers from an opioid addiction is at risk for fatal overdose.

Who should get Naloxone?

Those who live with someone who struggles with opioid addiction. Those who know someone who does. Naloxone not only saves lives, it saves families. It saves friends.
