PRE-TRIAL SCHEDULING ORDER (TVT Secur Discovery Pool)

THIS MATTER having been brought before the Court jointly by Defendants Ethicon, Inc. and Johnson & Johnson ("Defendants"), through their counsel Riker Danzig Scherer Hyland & Perretti, LLP, and Plaintiffs, through Plaintiffs' liaison counsel, and for good cause shown;

IT IS on this _____ day of November, 2016;

ORDERED as follows:

- 1. The following schedule will apply to the TVT Secur Core Discovery Pool Cases of Cook, BER-L-12792-14; Nelson BER-L-11949-14; and Sheppard BER-L-13926-14.
 - a. Fact discovery was largely completed on October 15, 2016, with the exception of limited outstanding issues including:
 - i. <u>Cook</u>: updated discovery relating to ongoing and medical treatment of Plaintiff, updated PFS required;
 - ii. <u>Sheppard</u>: completion of deposition of fact witness previously noticed by Defendants and expected to be completed in November, 2016, updated PFS required.;
 - iii. <u>Nelson</u>: completion of collection and review of medical records arising from updated PFS, and, if good cause exists, deposition of treater(s) regarding new treatment.
 - b. Plaintiffs' expert reports shall be served no later than November 7, 2016.

- c. Defendants' expert reports shall be served no later than **December 7**, 2016.
- d. Expert depositions shall not commence until after service of Defendants' expert reports and shall be completed by **January 13, 2017**.
- e. Pre-trial motions (dispositive, Kemp, motions *in limine*) shall be served and filed directly with Judge Harz's chambers by **January 27, 2017**.
- f. Oppositions to pretrial motions shall be filed and served by **February 17**, **2017.**
- g. Only where necessary, on leave of Court, limited replies shall be filed and served by **February 24, 2017**.
- h. Oral argument on pretrial motions shall be on a date or dates in March 2017, to be determined by the Court, but no later than the week of March 6, 2017.

2. Other Trial Submissions:

- specific and non-case specific witnesses on or before **December 23, 2016.**The designations shall be identified by page and line number and the parties have agreed to use the same Excel spreadsheet format for ease of reference and exchange. The designations shall specifically identify exhibits to be offered through the deposition testimony.
- b. Any objections to designations or any of the accompanying exhibits sought to be entered through the deposition testimony, and any counterdesignations and accompanying exhibits sought to be entered through the counter-designation testimony, shall be exchanged on or before **January** 23, 2017.
- c. Plaintiffs shall advise Defendants of any witness for whom Defendants have identified deposition designations to which Plaintiffs will object on

- the grounds that the witness needs to be brought live to trial rather than played by video on or before January 23, 2017.
- d. Any objections to the counter-designations and exhibits, and any counter-designations to an opposing party's counter-designations, shall be exchanged on or before February 13, 2017.
- e. The parties shall meet and confer no later than February 20, 2017, to resolve objections to designated testimony and exhibits and to resolve any proposed redactions to exhibits.
- f. Deposition designations agreed upon to be read at trial, along with identified exhibits as agreed and properly redacted, as well as any deposition designations and related exhibits in dispute shall be submitted to the Court by March 1, 2017.
- g. The Court shall hold hearings to resolve all outstanding objections on a date or dates to be set during the week of March 6, 2017.
- h. The parties shall exchange witness lists on or before **January 16, 2017**.
- On or before January 24, 2017, Plaintiffs shall advise Defendants of Defendants' corporate witnesses whom they request to call as live witnesses at trial.
- j. The parties shall exchange their lists of all exhibits that may be offered during each party's case in chief no later than January 31, 2017.
 Demonstratives and exhibits to be utilized solely for impeachment need not be included. The exhibit list shall be in the form of an Excel spreadsheet. The parties may supplement their exhibit lists from time to

time prior to and during trial provided the supplementations are reasonable in terms of scope and number of documents. The parties shall meet and confer regarding the deadline and manner by which they will exchange copies of all exhibits (e.g., on a hard drive, as separate .pdf or .tiff images, etc.).

- k. If a party elects to submit a hard copy of proposed exhibits to the Court for any purpose, and if the Court so permits, a duplicate shall also be provided to the adverse party.
- The parties shall disclose the identities of live witnesses who will testify at
 trial at least two business days prior to when the witness will be called. If
 the witness will be called on a Monday, then the witness must be disclosed
 by the end of court day on the preceding Friday.
- m. The parties shall exchange initial proposed jury instructions by January31, 2017, and thereafter shall meet and confer regarding jury instructions.
- n. The parties shall meet and confer regarding proposed jury instructions by February 27, 2017.

3. Jury Selection

- a. The parties shall meet and confer on a juror questionnaire by January 31,2017.
- b. A proposed agreed jury questionnaire must be submitted to the Court on or before February 15, 2017. If the parties are unable to agree upon a form of juror questionnaire, the parties should submit competing forms and identify for the Court those questions upon which they cannot agree.

- c. The parties shall agree upon a service to copy the final questionnaire to insure that there are sufficient copies for distribution to the jury pool and for duplication of the completed questionnaires for distribution among counsel. The cost of copying shall be borne equally by Plaintiff and Defendants.
- d. By February 28, 2017, the parties shall submit a concise descriptive statement of the nature of the cause of action not to exceed three pages in length for the Judge's use during jury selection.
- e. It is the Court's intention to bring in a jury pool during the week of March
 13, 2017, address hardship issues, and distribute the jury questionnaires,
 such that jury selection will begin on March 20, 2017.

4. Commencement of Trial

 a. Opening statements will commence on the first full court day following the selection of the jury.
