Attorneys from the Monmouth Bar Association and the Ocean-Monmouth Legal Services will offer free 15-minute consultations. Spanish language interpreters will be on hand.

On Saturday, May 21 a community information session will be held at the New Beginnings Agape Christian Center, Banquet Conference Center, 133 Throckmorton St., Freehold from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Court representatives will be on hand to provide information and brochures on court services, jobs (including internships), volunteer and vendor opportunities.
