**Morris and Sussex Law Day Events Scheduled to Celebrate Lincoln's Legacy
Supreme Court Associate Justice Jaynee LaVecchia to Speak at Morris Law Day Event;
High Point Regional High School Students to be Honored in Sussex County**

The Morris/Sussex Vicinage of the Superior Court will host Law Day events in both Counties. In the Sussex County courthouse in Newton, Law Day will be celebrated at 7 p.m. on Thursday, April 30. In the Morris County courthouse in Morristown, Law Day will be celebrated at noon on Friday, May 1.

In Morristown on Friday, Supreme Court Associate Justice Jaynee LaVecchia will give the keynote address on this year's Law Day theme, "A Legacy of Liberty: Celebrating Lincoln's Bicentennial." Other speakers include Morris/Sussex Assignment Judge B. Theodore Bozonelis, Gene F. Feyl, Morris County freeholder director; Roy J. Evans, president of the Morris County Bar Association; and Brian J. Fruehling, president of the Morris County Bar Foundation.

The event will be held on the front lawn of the Morris County Courthouse, Washington and Court streets, Morristown. The Morristown High School Vocal and String Ensemble, directed by Norma Davis, will perform. The West Morris Mendham High School mock trial team, winners of the 2009 Vincent J. Apruzzese High School Mock Trial Competition for Morris County, will be honored. In case of rain, the ceremony will be held in the assignment judge's courtroom on the 2nd floor of the courthouse.

In Sussex County on Thursday evening, the Law Day ceremony will be at the Sussex County Historic Courthouse, High and Spring streets, Newton. Mark J. Hontz, Sussex County Bar Association Law Day Chair, will give a keynote address, "Thoughts on the Bicentennial of Abraham Lincoln's Birth." Sussex Bar Association President Jennifer Kovach will present the 2009 Law Day Award to Nancy Heslin Reading for her volunteer efforts with the high school mock trial program. She also will introduce the Sussex Mock Trial winners from High Point Regional High School. The "Law Day Brass Quintet" will perform as they have in the past. This year they will be playing selections from Lincoln's era. Refreshments will be served.
