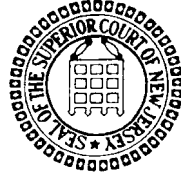

## **MONMOUTH VICINAGE PROBATION OFFICERS HONORED**

FREEHOLD – Three Monmouth Vicinage probation officers received awards from the Chief Probation Officers of New Jersey (CPONJ) at a ceremony today at the Probation Services building in Trenton. Acting Administrative Director Judge Glenn A. Grant presided over the program to recognize officers throughout the state. The ceremony was held during National Probation, Parole and Community Supervision Week to honor probation staff for outstanding leadership and achievements in juvenile and adult supervision and in child support matters.

Career achievement awards were presented to Monmouth Vicinage Senior Probation Officer Felicia Costantino and Investigator Bonnie Klein. Costantino has served in the probation division since 1991. She has made significant contributions to the Juvenile Supervision Unit, including the development of Project Pride and the vicinage parent orientation program.
