Chief Justice Stuart Rabner to Speak at Dedication of Courthouse Learning Center

Chief Justice Stuart Rabner will speak at a ceremony marking the dedication of the Linda R. Feinberg Learning Center at the Mercer County Criminal Courthouse. The ceremony will be held on Thursday, April 25th, at 3 p.m. in the Special Proceedings Courtroom on the fourth floor of the courthouse, 400 S. Warren St., Trenton.

Mercer Vicinage Assignment Judge Mary C. Jacobson will give welcoming remarks. Other speakers include Mercer County Executive Brian M. Hughes, retired Appellate Judge Philip S. Carchman, who preceded Judge Feinberg as assignment judge in Mercer Vicinage, and Mercer County Bar Association President Samuel M. Gaylord. Trial Court Administrator Sue Regan will give closing remarks.

Judge Linda R. Feinberg was the first woman assignment judge to lead the Mercer Vicinage. Appointed to the bench in January 1992 by Gov. Jim Florio, Judge Feinberg first was assigned to the family division and was named presiding judge of the division in 1993. She was named assignment judge in September 1997 and led the vicinage until her retirement in March 2012.

The Learning Center will be used to provide education and training to judges and staff. Naming the center after Judge Feinberg acknowledges the great strides the vicinage made under her leadership to expand and enhance development opportunities for judges and staff to improve court services to the public.
