**Middlesex Vicinage Holds Screening of “The Borinqueneers”  
Documentary Highlights All-Hispanic Army Regiment**

As a part of its community outreach initiative, the Middlesex Vicinage Advisory Committee on Minority Concerns will hold a screening of the documentary “The Borinqueneers” on Wednesday, Nov. 19 at 5 p.m. at the Middlesex County Courthouse, 56 Paterson St., New Brunswick.

“The Borinqueneers” is a documentary of the 65th Infantry Regiment of the U.S. Army who fought and sacrificed many lives during World War I, World War II, and the Korean War. The title comes from the Taino Indian word “Boriken” that refers to the name given to the island of Puerto Rico by its original inhabitants. The 65th was the only all-Hispanic army regiment, described by its commanders as an exemplary unit with strong leadership and esprit de corps that fought gallantly during the initial battles in Korea.
