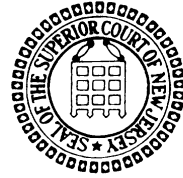

## **Monmouth Vicinage Probation Employees Honored**

Seven Monmouth Vicinage probation division employees were recognized by the Chief Probation Officers of New Jersey (CPONJ) at a ceremony last week at the Richard J. Hughes Justice Complex in Trenton.

Certificates of Meritorious Service were awarded to senior probation officers Sheri Bouldin and Paul Eulner and court services supervisor Timothy Wilson. Bouldin, a 24-year employee of the Judiciary, was recognized for her service toward outreach programs for local schools. Eulner, who works in juvenile supervision, was cited for his strong commitment to his clients. Wilson, a 30-year Judiciary employee, was recognized for training and mentoring new supervisors and staff.

Career Achievement Awards were presented to court services supervisors Gloria Brennan and Regina Underwood and investigator Vicki Weiss. Brennan's career with the Judiciary spans 37 years. She played a key role in the development and implementation of the vicinage's Comprehensive Enforcement Program, which she now supervises. Underwood's 35-year career in the Judiciary is marked by her role as an early leader in the inception of the vicinage's drug court program. Weiss, who works in the child support unit, was recognized for her strong knowledge of regulations and guidelines in handling complex cases.

Investigator Andrew Hagge of the child support unit received an Outstanding Achievement Award for his leadership abilities and diligent enforcement of child support orders.

Assignment Judge Lisa P. Thornton said, "Trial Court Administrator Gurpreet M. Singh joins me in congratulating our award winners on receiving this honor. The Monmouth Vicinage is thankful for the dedication and hard work of all our probation division employees.
