Somerset/Hunterdon/Warren Vicinage to Sponsor Court Night

The Somerset/Hunterdon/Warren Vicinage will sponsor a free seminar regarding record expungement and child support issues on Thursday May 11 from 6 to 9 p.m. at the Somerset County Courthouse, 20 N. Bridge St., Somerville.

The seminar, organized by the vicinage's Advisory Committee on Minority Concerns, will provide an overview of the adult and juvenile expungement process as well as the statutory requirements regarding the termination of child support.

The record expungement portion of the seminar will include an overview of eligibility factors, needed records, the application process, serving notice and expungement hearings. The presentation on child support termination will include an overview of the child support statute, notice requirements, requests for continuation, the administration of the termination process and expectations regarding interactions with the courts and the state Division of Family Development.

Speakers will include attorney Kareen Bar-Akiva, Stacey Amelung-Bogden of the Division of Family Development's Office of Child Support Services and Akil S. Roper, vice-president and assistant general counsel for Legal Services of New Jersey.
