Hudson Vicinage to Present Juvenile Justice Seminar

The Hudson Vicinage will hold a seminar, “What Would You Do? Handling Cases in the Juvenile Justice System,” an interactive discussion on the juvenile justice system, on Wednesday, June 13 from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Mary McLeod Bethune Community Center, 140 Martin Luther King Jr. Dr., Jersey City.

The seminar will provide information on the juvenile justice system from initial interaction with police through disposition of a case. The focus of the seminar is to help communities understand the difference between the adult and juvenile justice systems and learn how they can support youth in the system.

Representatives from the Hudson County Prosecutor’s Office, Public Defender’s Office, family court, probation division, ombudsman’s office, and Hudson Partnership CMO (Case Management Organization) will participate in a panel presentation.

The event is co-sponsored by the Hudson County Council on Juvenile Justice System Improvement in collaboration with the Royal Men Foundation, a non-profit organization whose mission is to promote the leadership potential of men in the Greenville area of Jersey City.

The workshop is free and open to the public.

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
