The Advisory Committee on Judicial Conduct having filed a presentment with the Court in respect of GERALD GORDON, a former Judge of the Municipal Court of New Brunswick, finding by clear and convincing evidence that he violated Canon 1 (a judge should personally observe high standards of conduct so the integrity and independence of the judiciary may be preserved), Canon 2A (a judge should respect and comply with the law and act at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the integrity and impartiality of the judiciary), Canon 3A(1)(a judge should be faithful to the law and maintain professional competence in it), Canon 3A(3) (a judge should be patient, dignified, and courteous to attorneys and others), and Canon 3C(1)(d)(i)(a judge should disqualify himself in a proceeding to which he is a party) of the Code of Judicial Conduct, and Rule 2:15-8(a)(6)(a judge should not engage in conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice that brings the judicial office into disrepute);

And the Committee having recommended that respondent be publicly reprimanded for his misconduct;

And good cause appearing;

It is ORDERED that pursuant to Rule 2:15-17(b)(2), GERALD GORDON, a former Judge of the Municipal Court of New Brunswick, shall show cause before this Court why he should not be publicly disciplined through the imposition of an appropriate sanction

that does not include removal from judicial office; and it is further

ORDERED that Candace Moody, Esquire, shall present this matter to the Court; and it is further

ORDERED that the parties shall file briefs on this Order to Show Cause, with respondent's brief to be served and filed on or before May 22, 2007, and the presenter's brief in response to be served and filed on or before May 30, 2007; and it is further

ORDERED that the matter shall be set down for oral argument on June 5, 2007, at 2:00 p.m., in the Supreme Court Courtroom, Hughes Justice Complex, Trenton.
