Theme:	Cornerstones of Democracy: Civics, Civility and Collaboration
	"In recent years, tensions in our democratic system have revealed deep divisions in American society. These divisions are aggravated by incivility in public discourse and insufficient understanding among many people about the Constitution and the way American government works. Together, however, we can collaborate to overcome our differences, resolve our disputes, and preserve our democracy and republic. To that end, we call on members of the legal profession to lead the way in promoting civics, civility, and collaboration—the cornerstones of our democracy.

Content:	The Art Contest is open to all Essex County students . Submissions should incorporate the 2023 Law Day theme and depict images pertaining to the theme as it relates to the court through the students' artistic expression. Submissions should be the students' original work. Artwork should refrain from using threatening, offensive, or abusive imagery. Listed below is some suggested content to get the students started. Submissions <u>are not</u> limited to the suggestions below.
	 Illustrate or depict images of the role that the courts play in the community. Illustrate or depict a landmark event in U.S. history that incorporates this year's theme. Illustrations can depict a current or historic event. Think of events where civics are the center of public debate, landmark cases, and the people who are now known because of these events. Think of images related to responsibility as citizens and rights people have fought for. Illustrate or depict what society might look like if as citizens we did not perform our "civic duties."
	 Create an advertisement that expresses the importance of civics education, performing our civic duties and being an informed citizen.

Format:	Acceptable forms of submissions include:
	 Poster (any size) Sculpture (any size)
	Art Contest submissions may include mixed media such as magazine, newspaper, fabric, paint, marker, pencil or computer-generated images.
Judging:	Submissions will be judged on the incorporation of the 2023 Law Day theme, overall presentation, and originality. First place, second place, third place and honorable mention(s) may be selected. Winners will be acknowledged at an awards ceremony in May 2023.
Identification:	 Include the following information for each submission: (1) Title of artwork (if applicable) (2) Student's name and mailing address (3) Student's grade and age (4) School or group name (5) Teacher or group coordinator name (if applicable) (6) Parent or guardian name, telephone number and email address.
Deadline:	Submissions will be accepted between March 15 to March 31, 2023.
Disclaimer:	All entries become the property of the Superior Court of New Jersey - Essex Vicinage. Students that submit a photo of their entry are encouraged to keep original entries until the contest has concluded. Images from selected submissions may be displayed in Judiciary publications and/or website. Entries will not be used for commercial purposes.
