## LAW DAY 2022 STUDENT ESSAY CONTEST

**GRADES 9-12** 

What is Law Day? Monmouth Vicinage's observance of "Law Day 2022" is part of a nationwide celebration coordinated by the American Bar Association. This year's Law Day theme is "Toward a More Perfect Union: The Constitution in Times of Change."

ESSAY PROMPT: The original Articles of Confederation said that Congress only had those powers "expressly delegated" to it by the states. In June 1788, the U.S. Constitution was adopted; Article II only outlined Congressional powers. In December 1791 the 10<sup>th</sup> Amendment was ratified and adopted. It states, "The powers <u>not</u> delegated to the United States by the Constitution, <u>nor</u> prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people." Write an essay discussing how the 10<sup>th</sup> Amendment has been applied by the states during the pandemic and give examples.

#### **Contest Rules:**

- The contest is open to grades 9 through 12.
- EACH SCHOOL IS LIMITED TO 10 ENTRIES PER GRADE.
- The essay must clearly address the topic and cannot exceed 600 words.
- Only original essays can be submitted. Essays must be typed in Microsoft Word and submitted via email to MonLawDay.Mailbox@njcourts.gov.
- Submissions must include the student's name, grade, school, teacher's name and email.

**DEADLINE:** Essays must be received by April 22, 2022.
