How to apply

- ✓ Visit *www.njcourts.gov*
- ✓ Click on *Law Clerk Recruitment*.
- ✓ Locate the *General Assignment Order* to find judges/justices by your preferred geographical region and court division.
- ✓ Click on the *Judges' Chambers Listing* to locate the mailing addresses for New Jersey judges/justices.
- ✓ To apply, mail your cover letter and resume directly to the judges' chambers.

Unpaid positions are available during the summer or school year (usually class credit can be arranged). For summer positions, students begin applying after final exams for the fall semester. For school-year internships, apply two to three months before the desired start date.

Note: The law clerk recruitment webpage/portal is not used for submitting internship applications.
