- 5. Brian J. Healy, Esquire shall have all pleadings, briefs, and other papers filed in this Court signed by an attorney of record authorized to practice in the State of New Jersey and before this Court, who shall be responsible for said papers, the conduct of the litigation and the attorney admitted herein;
- 6. Brian J. Healy, Esquire or any other out of state attorney cannot be designated as trial counsel and must be accompanied by a member of the New Jersey Bar for all proceedings, unless specifically waived by the Court.
- 7. No discovery, motion, trial or any other proceeding delay shall occur or be requested by reason of the inability of Brian J. Healy, Esquire to be in attendance;
- 8. Brian J. Healy, Esquire must, within (10) days of admission, pay the fees required by R.1:20-1(b) and R. 1:28-2 and submit an affidavit of compliance;
- 9. Non-compliance with any rules relating to admission pro hac vice shall be grounds for removal; and it is further

ORDERED that service of this Order shall be deemed effectuated upon all parties upon its upload to e-courts. Pursuant to Rule 1:5-1(a), movant shall serve a copy of this Order on all parties not served electronically within seven (7) days of the date of this Order.

UNOPPOSED
