IT IS on this 18 day of March, 2014,

ORDERED that Golriz Shoai-Naini, Esq. is hereby admitted pro hac vice, pursuant to R. 1:21-2, for all purposes to represent the plaintiffs in the above-referenced matters in association with New Jersey counsel at the law firm of Lynch Daskal Emery LLP; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

(1) Ms. Shoai-Naini shall abide by the New Jersey Court Rules, including all disciplinary rules, R. 1:20-1 and R. 1-28:2.



(2) Ms. Shoai-Naini shall, and hereby does, consent to the appointment of the Clerk of the Supreme Court as an agent upon whom service of process may be made for all actions against her firm that may arise out of her participation in the above-referenced matters.

(3) Ms. Shoai-Naini shall immediately notify the Court of any matter affecting her standing at the bar of any other Court.

(4) Ms. Shoai-Naini shall have all pleadings, briefs and other papers filed with the Court signed by an attorney of record authorized to practice in New Jersey, who shall be responsible for them, the conduct of the litigation, and the admitted attorney.

(5) Ms. Shoai-Naini shall not be designated as trial counsel.

(6) No discovery, motion, trial, or any other proceeding delay shall occur or be requested by reason of the inability of Ms. Shoai-Naini to be in attendance.

(7) Ms. Shoai-Naini must, within ten (10) days, pay the fees required by R. 1:20-1(b) and R. 1:28-2 and submit an affidavit of compliance.

(8) Pro hac vice admission will automatically terminate for failure to make the initial and any annual payment required by R. 1:20-1(b) and R. 1:28-2.

(9) Non-compliance with any of the terms of this order shall constitute grounds for removal.

(10) A copy of this order shall be served on all parties within seven (7) days of the date of this order.
