ORDER FOR ADMISSION OF COUNSEL PRO HAC VICE

This matter being opened to the court by James Tracy, Esquire, a New Jersey attorney and the attorney of record for Plaintiff, Nicole Reda, to permit David G. - 1. David G. Bryant shall abide by the *New Jersey Court Rules* including all disciplinary rules, *R.* 1:20-1 and *R.* 1:28-2.
- 2. David G. Bryant shall, and hereby does, consent to the appointment of the Clerk of the Supreme Court as his agent upon whom service of process may be made for all actions against David G. Bryant that may arise out of his participation in the matter.
- 3. David G. Bryant shall immediately notify the court of any matter affecting his standing at the Bar of any other jurisdiction.
- 4. David G. Bryant shall have all pleadings, briefs and other papers filed with the court signed by an attorney of record authorized to practice in New Jersey, who shall be held responsible for them, the conduct of the litigation and the attorney admitted herein.
- 5. David G. Bryant must, within ten (10) days, pay the fees required by R. 1:20-1(b) and R. 1:28-2 and submit an affidavit of compliance.
- 6. Pro hac vice admission will automatically terminate for failure to make the initial and any annual payment required by R. 1:20-1(b) and R. 1:28-2.

7. Non-compliance with any of the terms of this order shall constitute grounds for removal.

8. A copy of this order shall be served on all parties within seven (7) days of the date hereof.

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
