

NOTICE TO THE BAR

APPLICATION FOR CENTRALIZED MANAGEMENT OF BARD PELVIC MESH LITIGATION AND COORDINATION WITH ETHICON/GYNECARE/JOHNSON & JOHNSON PELVIC MESH LITIGATION WITHOUT MASS TORT DESIGNATION

A previous Notice to the Bar advised of an application to the Supreme Court pursuant to Directive #7-09, "Revised Mass Tort Guidelines," requesting that all Ethicon/Gynecare/Johnson & Johnson pelvic mesh litigation be assigned for centralized management to Middlesex County but without designation as a mass tort. The Court has not yet acted on that application. This Notice is to advise of a second application relating to pelvic mesh litigation. This second application requests that all pelvic mesh litigation involving C.R. Bard, Inc. be assigned for centralized management and coordinated with the Ethicon/Gynecare/Johnson & Johnson litigation that was the subject of the previous notice.
