Re: Proof of Service of Process - Requirement to List Names and Addresses of All Attorneys/Parties Served - Reminder of Relaxation and Supplementation of Rule 1:5-3

The Supreme Court, by order of January 16, 2001, relaxed and supplemented Rule 1:5-3 ("Proof of Service") of the Rules of Court so as to require that proof of service of papers served pursuant to Rule 1:5-1 specifically list the names and addresses of all attorneys served and to identify the parties those attorneys represent, as well as to list the names and addresses of all pro se parties served. The initial notice regarding this rule relaxation was published in the February 12, 2001 legal newspapers. However a number of Civil Presiding Judges have advised that there is not yet uniform compliance with the provisions of the rule as thus relaxed and supplemented. I am therefore issuing this reminder notice. A copy of the Court's January 16, 2001 order is attached.
