NOTICE TO THE BAR

LOCAL FILING AND ENFORCEMENT OF OUT-OF-STATE CUSTODY/PARENTING TIME/VISITATION ORDERS

New Jersey's Uniform Child Custody and Jurisdiction Act (UCCJA), N.J.S.A. 2A:34-38 to N.J.S.A. 2A:34-52, requires the Clerk of the Superior Court to maintain a registry of out-of- state custody orders. To facilitate filing and enforcement of such out-of-state custody orders, the Supreme Court has authorized the Clerk to delegate that responsibility to the Family Division Managers.

<u>Directive #7-02</u> (copy attached), issued September 26, 2002, sets forth new procedures that allow these out-of-state custody/parenting time/visitation orders to be filed in the appropriate county of venue, rather than in Trenton, for purposes of entry onto the registry. There is a \$5.00 filing fee for such registration of the out-of-state order (N.J.S.A. 22A:2-20).

<u>Directive #7-02</u> also sets forth procedures for the enforcement of these out-of-state orders, in the appropriate county of venue, either by way of order to show cause or by regular motion.
