Published with this Notice are <u>proposed amendments to four Rules of Court relating to the court-annexed arbitration program</u>. The Supreme Court invites written comments on these proposed rule amendments that were recommended by the Court's Arbitration Advisory Committee. The proposed amendments are the result of discussions and suggestions at the Judiciary-sponsored statewide arbitration conference that was held in May 2003.
