

NOTICE TO THE BAR
2009-2011 SUPREME COURT RULES COMMITTEE REPORTS –
PUBLICATION FOR COMMENT

The Supreme Court invites written comments on the 2009-2011 reports of the Supreme Court rules and program committees published with this notice. In those reports, the committees (as listed below) make numerous recommendations to the Supreme Court for rule amendments and other non-rule administrative actions. As noted previously, the Court has staggered the reporting cycles of its rules committees, such that approximately half submit their respective reports each year.

The committees whose 2009-2011 reports are here published for comment are as follows: (1) Committee on Complementary Dispute Resolution, (2) Family Practice Committee, (3) Municipal Court Practice Committee, (4) Committee on the Rules of Evidence, and (5) Committee on Minority Concerns. The two committees whose 2009-2011 supplemental reports are here published for comment are as follows: (1) Criminal Practice Committee, and (2) Family Practice Committee. The due date for written comments on the two supplemental reports is Monday, April 18, 2011.

Some of the appendices referenced in the reports may not be included in this publication; copies of any omitted appendices are available on request.
