

NOTICE TO THE BAR

MULTICOUNTY LITIGATION – PROPOSED TERMINATION OF MULTICOUNTY LITIGATION (MCL) DESIGNATION OF THE GADOLINIUM LITIGATION

By Order of April 8, 2008, the Supreme Court designated all New Jersey state court litigation involving Gadolinium-based diagnostic contrast agents as a mass tort (now multicounty litigation (MCL)) and assigned it to Middlesex County for centralized management by Judge Jamie D. Happas. By Order of August 7, 2009, the MCL was reassigned to Superior Court Judge Jessica R. Mayer. Judge Mayer has reported to the Administrative Director of the Courts that all active litigation has been resolved and that the MCL designation of the Gadolinium Litigation therefore should be terminated.

In accordance with the provisions of Court Rule 4:38A and the Multicounty Litigation Guidelines (Directive #8-12), this Notice is to advise of the proposed termination of the MCL designation of the New Jersey state-court Gadolinium Litigation. Any comments on or objections to this proposed action must be submitted in writing, with relevant supporting documentation, to the Administrative Director of the Courts, P.O. Once this comment period has closed, the proposed termination of the MCL designation will be submitted to the Supreme Court for its consideration and action.
