NOTICE TO THE BAR

Foreclosure – Motions for Final Judgment – Discontinuation of Practice

OF SENDING RETURN NOTICES TO CURE DEFICIENT SUBMISSIONS

This notice to the bar sets forth a change in the motion practice related to final

judgments filed in foreclosure. Specifically, effective July 1, 2016, motions for final judgment

of foreclosure submitted to the Office of Foreclosure in the Superior Court Clerk's Office will

be either granted or denied based on the motion and supporting documents as submitted.

At present, when such motions are submitted with deficiencies the Office of

Foreclosure returns to the filing party a written explanation of the deficiencies that require

correction in order to issue the order for final judgment, with the filing party having twenty

days to cure the identified deficiencies or the motion for final judgment is denied. As of July

1, 2016 that practice of returning deficient motions for final judgment of foreclosure will end.

Thereafter, the Office of Foreclosure will no longer issue return notices, rather the motions for

final judgment will be granted or denied based on the motion and supporting documents as

submitted. Where a motion for final judgment is denied, the order will set forth the reasons

for the denial.
