2018-2020 SUPREME COURT RULES COMMITTEE REPORTS – CIVIL PRACTICE, SPECIAL CIVIL PART PRACTICE, TAX COURT – PUBLICATION FOR COMMENT

The Supreme Court invites written comments on three 2018-2020 reports of Supreme Court rules committees for this rules cycle. In those reports, the committees (as listed below) make numerous recommendations to the Supreme Court for rule amendments and other non-rule administrative actions. As noted previously, the Court has staggered the reporting cycles of its rules committees, such that approximately half submit their respective reports each year.

The three committees whose 2018-2020 reports are published with this notice for comment are as follows: **(1) Civil Practice Committee, (2) Special Civil Part Practice Committee, and (3) Committee on the Tax Court.** These reports are also available on the Judiciary's internet website at <http://www.njcourts.gov/courts/supreme/reports.html>.



The Supreme Court will conduct a public hearing on these reports in May and will be acting on the reports and recommendations in June-July, with any rule amendments to become effective September 1, 2020.
