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Somerset/Hunterdon/Warren Vicinage to Hold Landlord Tenant Webinar

The Somerset/Hunterdon/Warren Vicinage will host a virtual landlord tenant seminar to explain court processes and procedures on Tuesday, Oct. 5 from 2 to 4 p.m.

Topics to be addressed include:

- the role of courts in resolving landlord tenant matters focusing on eviction complaints.
- the status of court processes relating to non-payment of rent.
- the rights and responsibilities of landlords and tenants.
- community resources available to assist landlords and tenants in navigating the process.
- identifying potential financial assistance.
- reducing the risks of housing instability resulting from evictions due to non-payment of rent.
- the services of the Judiciary's ombudsman program.

The seminar will be presented by civil division judges and staff, in coordination with Elliott D. Harris of Legal Services of Northwest Jersey; attorney Matthew Bradley; Alicia Noon, accounting and special projects manager with the Somerset County Department of Finance and Administrative Services; and Dean Dafis of the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.
