

# LANGUAGE IDENTIFICATION GUIDE<sup>1</sup>

## Introduction

This Guide is based primarily on ETHNOLOGUE: LANGUAGES OF THE WORLD.<sup>2</sup> The web edition was used for this update.<sup>3</sup> The purposes of the Guide are to--

- promote the ability of managers of court interpreting services to match needs for interpreters of court customers who do not speak English with interpreters proficient in each person's language; and
- provide nomenclature for names so that statistical reports on interpreting services are uniform and consistent over time.

Each language in this list has been included because it meets one or more of the following criteria:

1. It is spoken by 10 million or more persons;
2. It is spoken by persons who have needed interpreters in New Jersey's courts;
3. It needs to be included to differentiate among several varieties of a "language," e.g., Arabic;
4. One or more interpreters who speak the language have registered with the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts; and
5. It is a language for which a registered agency purports to be able to provide competent court interpreters.

The first column, "Name of Language," provides each language's primary name and, where applicable, the alternate names that are sometimes used. *Ethnologue* indicates that these names are "...an anglicized form of the name used to refer to that language in that country. In most cases the name is the one that the speakers prefer if such a preference is known. However, speakers within a language community may have different opinions about which name they prefer." It does not include the names of dialects. When alternate names are quite close to the primary name in terms of spelling, any such names are included in parentheses in the same cell with the primary name. When alternate names are not close to how the primary name is spelled, they are listed elsewhere with a reference in the middle column to use the primary name, which is identified therein. This Guide does not include the names of dialects.

The middle column, “Special Information,” has two purposes: (1) It provides any information such as a country or regions within a country where the language is spoken that might be helpful in identifying and then selecting a given language — especially for related languages for which there are many different names such as Mixtec and Quechua. (2) When the name(s) in the first column constitute alternate names, it directs the user to the language name that should be used for purposes of seeking a court interpreter and providing statistical reports.

The codes in the third column are the result of collaboration between the staff of *Ethnologue* and the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) to create an international standard for language codes. With the exception of entries that are marked with an asterisk (\*), all codes are taken from *Ethnologue*. For more information about the codes, see <http://www.ethnologue.com/codes>.

The entries for Arabic have been modified from *Ethnologue* by an expert on Arabic linguistics, Dr. Elizabeth M. Bergman, in consultation with Adel Abdel-Malek, a retired United Nations translator.

The entries for Chinese have been modified from *Ethnologue* by an expert on Chinese linguistics, Dr. Weiping Wu, of the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

The entry for Montenegrin was recommended by linguists Dr. Barbara Meier Mozdierz, in consultation with Branka Bogetic, a linguist at the Department of State, and Dr. Teodora Burian, of Northeastern Illinois University.

## Sign Languages

Use the appropriate type of sign language, e.g., American Sign Language, Puerto Rican Sign Language, or Russian Sign Language. For the person who does not communicate primarily through a named sign language, use “Idiosyncratic Gestural System.”
