Dear Judge Grant:

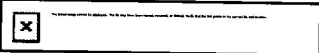
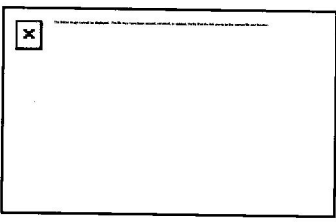
