The Camden County Women's Center writes in support of the NJCBW's position on the proposed UMHDPP and their concerns

relating to Victim Counselor Privilege, and the rights and safety of domestic violence/sexual assault victims. We submit our

comment that the Victim-Counselor Privilege statute (VCP) should not be included in the Rules of Evidence Committee's

proposed Unified Mental Health Service Provider Privilege Statute (UMHSPP).

New Jersey's Victim Counselor Privilege (VCP) is so different in nature and purpose than mental health privileges such as

psychologist or social worker privileges that is does not belong with a mental health privilege of any kind. In fact, a "victim

counselor" is not a profession. It was created to describe a relationship for the purpose of creating a privilege for victims of crimes

and is defined only in the Victim Counselor Privilege statute. It does not exist outside this statute as mental health professions

exist outside their privilege statutes. The Camden County Women's Center believes that is why other states that have both a

victim counselor privilege and a unified mental health privilege, excluded their VCP from their unified mental health privilege,

including the state of California.

Most importantly, the Camden County Women's Center agrees that the inclusion of the VCP would weaken its "absolute" nature

potentially compromising the safety of victims of domestic violence and other crimes. Domestic and sexual violence programs are

routinely subpoenaed for victim records by defense attorneys seeking to discredit the victim. New Jersey's strong VCP has

prevented the piercing of privilege in the vast majority of these cases. Should a UMHSPP result in a number of cases being

pierced, this in turn will result in a reluctance by many victims to talk about their abuse, the opposite impact intended by the VCP.

Camden County Women's Center respectfully asks the Rules of Evidence Committee to reconsider their position and exclude the

VCP from their proposed MHSPPS.
