Respecting the proposed amendment to R. 2:6-2(b), to require a table of citations (TOC) in letter-briefs, please consider the following comment:

The official comment to the proposed rule states that "most law firms have the capacity to insert a table of citations ...with... no extra effort." However, that is not true for many solo practitioners. Therefore, I would respectfully oppose the amendment, as it now reads.

On the other hand, I agree with the committee's desire to <u>encourage</u> inclusion of TOCs in letter-briefs. This could be accomplished by a rule making the TOC optional in letter briefs, and by further providing that TOC pages would not count towards the 20 page length limitation.
