The National Consortium mission statement provides that we are

The proposed amendment aligns with the objectives of the National Consortium and our quest for a bias free judicial system. We applaud the New Jersey Supreme Court, DICE and the AOC administration for taking decisive steps to advance their stated recommitment to ensure the New Jersey court system eliminates barriers to equal justice.
