Dear Judge McVeigh:

We are in receipt of the objection filed by Shaun I Blick, Esq. on behalf of Edward and Molly Tonerero, and ask that it be stricken.

A Complaint for Foreclosure was filed against Molly Tonerero in the matter captioned HSBC Bank USA, National Association as Trustee for Wells Fargo Asset Securities Corporation, Mortgage Pass-Through Certificates, Series 2007-4 v. Tonerero, docket number F-18639-09, in Hunterdon County. Default was entered on April 21, 2010. Two and a half years later, the Tonereros now seek to raise issues regarding the standing of the plaintiff in their individual foreclosure case. The Tonereros argue that Wells Fargo lacked standing to commence the litigation, but fail to recognize that Wells Fargo is not the plaintiff in their foreclosure case.

The Tonereros also ask for an Order requiring Wells Fargo to attend foreclosure mediation and resolve the matter, and seek to invalidate any settlements they have previously entered into with Wells Fargo. The Tonereros do not identify any prior settlements that relate to their foreclosure case.


Pursuant to the Order to Show Cause filed July 19, 2012 and the Amended Order to Show Cause filed September 17, 2012, Foreclosure Defendants had the right to object in this proceeding to the process by which this Court gave Wells Fargo permission to serve the corrected NOI. If a Foreclosure Defendant objected to any of the contents of the corrected NOI, they were required to file a written objection under the docket number for their individual foreclosure action.

The Tonereros' objection does not relate to the Order to Show Cause process. Accordingly, if it may be filed anywhere, it must be filed in their individual foreclosure action.

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We thank the Court for its consideration of this matter.
