It is further ORDERED that the following peremptory briefing schedule

is established for these appeals:

- Appellant's brief limited to 50 pages is due by May 1, 2026.
- Combined respondents'/cross-appellants' briefs limited to 75 pages are due by June 1, 2026.
- Combined appellant's reply brief/cross-respondent's brief limited to 40 pages is due by July 1, 2026.
- Motions for leave to appear as amicus curiae and proposed amicus merits briefs limited to 30 pages are due by July 13, 2026. The Court will not accept motions to extend or relax the time for filing an amicus motion or brief.
- Respondents/Cross-Appellants may file a reply brief limited to 15 pages by July 27, 2026. The reply brief should include responses, if any, to the merits of any proposed amicus curiae briefs. If respondents/cross-appellants oppose participation by any proposed amicus party, they may file an answer in opposition to the amicus motion(s) also by July 27, 2026.
- Appellant/Cross-Respondent may file a brief limited to 15 pages responding to the merits of any proposed amicus curiae brief by July 27, 2026. If appellant opposes participation by any proposed amicus party, appellant may file an answer in opposition to the amicus motion(s) also on July 27, 2026.
